2005 RECIPIENT OF THE MALOLEY AWARD

The 2005 recipient of the Nancy A. Maloley Outstanding Public Servant Award is Dr. Carol D'Amico, Chancellor of Ivy Tech State College - Central Indiana. This award honors a Hoosier Republican woman who has demonstrated extraordinary dedication to serving the public good through appointed governmental or political office. Few people have worked harder or made as important a contribution to the civic life of our state as Carol D'Amico, making her an obvious choice to receive the third Maloley Award and an ideal role model for other women public servants.

In her current role, Carol leads Indiana's largest community college, serving 14,5000 students and 800 staff and faculty members. A recognized expert on education and workforce development issues, she provides leadership on programs that contribute to the state's economy. Carol's expertise is nationally recognized as well, and she is a frequently sought out by corporate and government leaders for advice on strategies to strengthen America through an educated workforce.

Appointed by President Bush in 2001, Carol served as the Assistant Secretary for the Office of Vocational and Adult Education until 2003. She was the leading advisor to the President and Secretary of Education on all matters related to high school reform, community/technical colleges and adult literacy. Prior to joining the Bush Administration, Carol served as the Dean of Workforce, Economic, and Community Development at Ivy Tech Community College from 1999-2001. At Hudson Institute, Carol was both a Senior Fellow in Education and Co-Director of the Center for Workforce Development from 1990-1999, where she co-authored Workforce 2020. Early in her career, she served in staff positions for the Indiana Department of Education and the General Assembly.

Carol holds an Ed.D. in higher education leadership and policy studies and a Masters degree in adult education and organizational development from Indiana University.

Carol's dedication to public service and education and her commitment to the highest professional standards distinguish her career and make her deserving of this honor and our appreciation.
